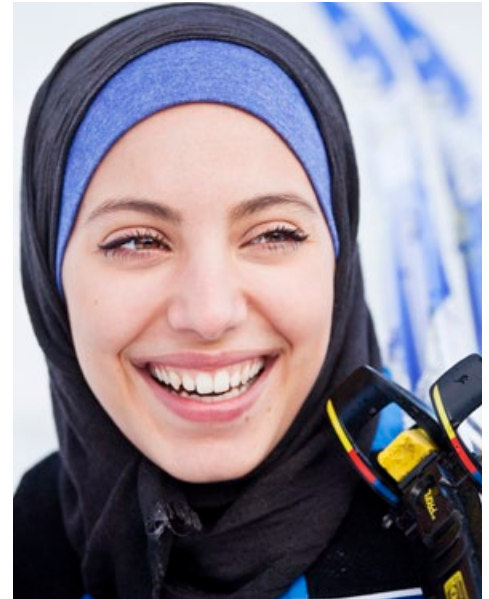


Reach your full potential —study in Sweden.

Applying for admission: a guide for international students.



Convenient online admission process.

You can apply to all courses and programs at all Swedish universities at the same website: *Universityadmissions.se*. There you can search the complete catalogue of courses, submit your application, pay your application fee and receive your admission notification. Create your personal user account at *Universityadmissions.se* today.

Completing your application.

After submitting your admission application and paying the application fee (SEK 900), the next step is to send copies of your grade transcripts and proof of English skills. Find out what you need to submit, how to submit it, where and when at *Universityadmissions.se*. Information about the whole process can be found under “All you need to know.”

Notification of selection results.

Once the application period is completed and all the applications have been reviewed, you’ll receive your admission notification—the Notification of Selection Results—on *Universityadmissions.se*. Be sure to reply to your offer in order to keep any places you’ve been offered or your place on a waiting list (reserve).

Scholarships.

Visit *Studyinsweden.se/scholarships* for information about the Swedish Institute scholarships and eligibility, as well as links to other organizations in Sweden that offer scholarships to international students. There are a number of scholarships available



for international students, the availability vary from year to year and the competition is intense.

The Swedish Institute scholarships.

The scholarships offered by the Swedish Institute cover the tuition fee as well as living expenses in Sweden, at a level equivalent to a Swedish student's living expenses. A list of successful scholarship candidates is published on *Studyinsweden.se/scholarships*. Each successful candidate receives an official scholarship offer by e-mail and is requested to accept or decline this offer.

Paying your tuition fee.

If you've accepted your place on a course or a master's program, your next step is to pay the first installment of your tuition fee. Your university will contact you with the details. Please note that your residence permit application cannot be approved until you've paid the tuition fee.

Residence permit.

After you've paid your tuition fee installment, it's time to apply for a residence permit with the Swedish Migration Board. In addition to having been offered a place and paying the tuition fee, you will also need to verify that you will have a guaranteed amount of money at your disposal throughout the entire period of your studies. All applications must be submitted at a Swedish consulate or embassy. Your residence permit will then be issued to you by the Swedish Migration Board. Final details.

You're almost ready to begin your studies in Sweden. There are just a few practical details left before your arrival:

- Visit your university's website to find out when your course begins.
- Find accommodation (housing). Contact your university for help in your search.
- Check whether your home bank has a partner in Sweden. You should do the same with your insurance company.
- Get in touch with the student union—they'll have valuable information for you.
- Get a good guidebook—it will be a great reference for your time in Sweden.
